Completed searches for two reference librarians and for a new director while maintaining a high level of services.

Renovated the Reference Desk to be more approachable and re-arranged the Reading Room to be more supportive of electronic resources.

The Biggest Challenges Facing Your Library in the Coming Year

Addressing numerous **facilities difficulties** including non-ADA compliant stacks on first and second floors, poor climate control for Rare Books Room, insufficient electrical outlets at Reading Room tables, and insufficient group study space;

Improving access to North Carolina and 4th Circuit Court of Appeals court records and briefs, both through detailed cataloging and possible digitization; and

Securing stable funding for collections price increases and for purchase of new electronic resources.

Other Developments

The Law Library shares a building with the UNC School of Law and is participating in a review of options for a building expansion and renovation.

The Law Library will conduct a national search for the Assistant Director for Public Services position during the summer and fall of 2007.
