The Most Exciting Things that Your Library Did Last Year

Librarians developed a plan for **updating the library website**, scheduled for release early in the fall of 2008. The website will include a database and indexing of law faculty scholarships.

Law Librarians **taught 6 courses totaling 16 credit hours** in the Law School and **1 course at 3 credit hours** in the School of Information and Library Science. The courses were Advanced Legal Research and Writing, Advanced Legal Research, Introduction to United States Law, Privacy Law Seminar, and Copyright for Librarians. In addition, law librarians taught several Continuing Legal Education courses to attorneys at the School of Law's Festival of Legal Learning.

The **Library Reading Room** was reconfigured for more electricity to the tables and updated with new chairs, new carpet, and improved signage.

The Biggest Challenges Facing Your Library in the Coming Year

The Law Library facility has many limitations. Librarians will work with the Law School and an architectural firm to **design a new building** for the Carolina North campus.

Budget challenges continue to play a large role in the Law Library planning for collections, personnel, and operations.

The **new campus document delivery service** for students and faculty at UNC-CH will require new procedures and education of the user community.

Other Developments

The Law Library conducted **successful searches** for both librarian and support staff positions during the year.
